



## **Measure B keeps Union City Transit running!**

Measure B is a half-cent transportation sales tax administered by the Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC). Measure B funds various projects and programs throughout Alameda County including Mass Transit Service. Measure B continues to help fund the operations and maintenance of Union City's own bus system, Union City Transit. Service is provided on five routes throughout the City's neighborhoods. Union City Transit makes connections with BART, AC Transit and the Dumbarton Express. Major connection points are at the BART station and the Union Landing Transit Center. Union City Transit has been replacing all of its older diesel buses with compressed natural gas (CNG) vehicles and will eventually become a 100% alternative fueled fleet. Half of the fleet is now CNG. Service is provided seven days a week in fully accessible buses. In Fiscal Year 2010, Union City Transit served over 448,000 passengers. This was a slight decrease from the previous year and likely due to the recession. But this year, we expect to have almost 480,000 riders. Our services would not be possible with the help of Measure B funds. Measure B ... your tax dollars at work!
